
Millions of Christians around the world are gathering for the Global Day of Prayer for Burma.

Despite some democratic reforms in that country, more than 100,000 ethnic Burmese are still living as refugees in neighboring Thailand. In recent weeks, government troops have attacked the Kachin people, many of whom are Christian.

Christians are praying for greater religious freedom for Burma and for God to give believers there the strength to endure persecution.

Among the prayer targets are for God's truth and love to penetrate Burma; for lasting peace and freedom in the nation; and for the restoration of democracy, ethnic rights and freedom for all political prisoners.

Decades of civil war, isolation, ethnic conflict, humanitarian issues, etc., have left Myanmar in desperate need. While there have been many signs of positive change in Myanmar, there are still tremendous needs ranging from ethnic conflict and civil war to hunger and poverty. There are two very serious crisis' presently occurring: In the North (the Kachin) and in the West (the Rohingya). These are life and death situations.

To Raise a Victory



When I prayed for Myanmar the story of Joshua and Jericho came to mind. I felt God was saying that the church in Myanmar needed to know the Lord of Hosts was with them (Joshua 5:13-15). When they were commanded to march around the city it was a heavily fortified city and all shut up (Joshua 6:1). This is like the nation of Myanmar at the present time. The people were commanded not to raise their voices as they march and I felt this was like the people of God in Myanmar where at times it can feel like their voice is not heard (Joshua 6:10). But God was saying that a time is coming for a victory shout and the walls of the city will come down. God's people should be encouraged to stay united, to work together, and to follow their leaders and particularly those who lead in prayer, worship and authority. We should pray for Myanmar that the walls come down in the right way and at the right time by God's leading so that His people can establish His good news in the land not western philosophy but the good news of Jesus. The Lords command to circle the city seven times is a strange one but in our obedience He is winning the battle. We carry our trumpets with us ready to shout. May the church in Myanmar be obedient to the Lord and carry with it its victory in Jesus in the time of enemy strongholds and know the time to raise a victory cry.
